

THE VILLAGE INFORMANT

Wednesday, May 18 and Wednesday, July 20, 2011 are village cleanup days. This is a great opportunity for all residents to take advantage of, due to unlimited trash pickup (at no additional charge). Trash needs to be bagged, each bag weighing less than 50 lbs. Carpet needs to be cut in 4 ft. sections, bundled and tied – no more than 50 lbs. Yard waste must be bagged or tied in bundles – no more than 4 ft. long. ****Any item containing Freon (refrigerator, freezer, dehumidifier, air conditioner) must be tagged by a certified tech that they have been drained. Items not taken: tires, paint, no liquid waste or chemicals, batteries, car parts, or glass windows and doors.**

Trash is not to be put out to the street any earlier than 12 hours prior to scheduled pickup and all containers must be removed from along the street no later than 16 hours after trash is picked up. If containers remain curbside after such time, the containers shall be removed Fridays at noon by the Village and taken to sewer plant.

Please note trash pickup is for Leesburg residents only. It has been noted that some people are allowing people outside the corporation to bring in trash. In order to keep the cost of trash pickup down please refrain from bringing garbage in from out of town.

The Village Administrator would like residents to know that the Village will pick up trees limbs for disposal. Please contact the water/sewer department at 937-780-3281 to make arrangements.
